Day by Day Programme

DAY 1

Arrival in London Foundations of the Capital

Arrival at London Heathrow where your driver guide meets the group for transfer into central London. The programme begins with timed entry admission to the Tower of London, where the Crown Jewels and medieval fortress galleries introduce England royal heritage. Lunch is reserved at Butlers Wharf Chop House overlooking Tower Bridge. In the afternoon enjoy a Thames River Cruise to Westminster providing panoramic views of the Houses of Parliament and St Paul Cathedral followed by timed entry to the London Eye. Dinner is pre arranged at The Ivy City Garden. Overnight in London.

DAY 2

Royal London and Wartime Legacy

Begin the morning with timed entry admission to Westminster Abbey, Britain's coronation church and one of the nation's most important historic monuments. Continue to the Churchill War Rooms where exhibitions reveal Britain's wartime leadership beneath Whitehall. Lunch is reserved at The Goring Dining Room, long associated with royal London. In the afternoon enjoy optional pre-booked admission to Kensington Palace exploring the royal apartments and gardens. Dinner is arranged at Scott's Mayfair. Overnight in London.



Day by Day Programme

DAY 3

Greenwich and Britain's Maritime Power

Travel east along the Thames for a day exploring Britain maritime legacy. The morning begins with admission to the Cutty Sark, the Victorian tea clipper preserved in dry dock. Continue with entry to the National Maritime Museum presenting the story of Britain naval and trading power. Lunch is reserved at The Old Brewery Restaurant within the historic naval college complex. In the afternoon enjoy timed entry to the Royal Observatory Greenwich standing on the Prime Meridian and offering views across London. Dinner is arranged at Smith and Wollensky London. Overnight in London.

DAY 4

Oxford Scholarship and Blenheim Grandeur

Depart London travelling west into Oxfordshire. The morning features timed entry admission to Blenheim Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill, exploring the State Rooms and landscaped gardens. Lunch is reserved at The Orangery Restaurant within the palace estate. Continue into Oxford where pre booked entry to Christ Church College reveals one of the university most historic colleges and cathedral. The afternoon continues with admission to the Ashmolean Museum, Britain first public museum housing global collections. Dinner is arranged at The Old Parsonage Restaurant. Overnight in Oxford.

DAY 5

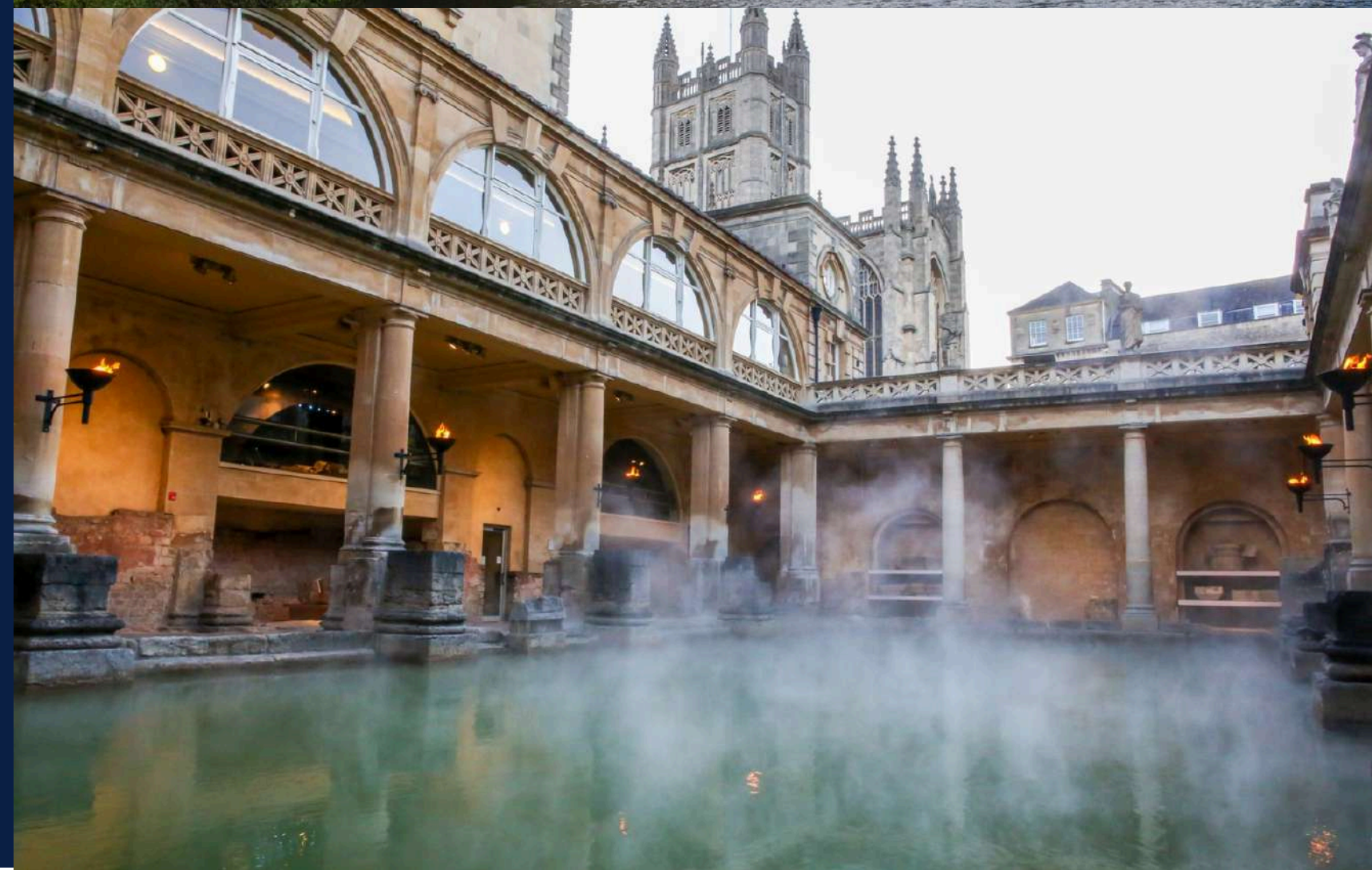
Shakespeare's England and the Cotswolds

Travel north to Stratford upon Avon, birthplace of William Shakespeare. The morning includes admission to Shakespeares Birthplace where exhibitions present the playwright early life and Elizabethan England. Continue with entry to Anne Hathaways Cottage, a preserved Tudor farmhouse surrounded by gardens. Lunch is reserved at The Arden Hotel Restaurant. In the afternoon enjoy admission to Warwick Castle where restored interiors and exhibitions bring medieval England to life. Continue into the Cotswolds where dinner is arranged at The Wild Rabbit Restaurant. Overnight in the Cotswolds.

DAY 6

Bath and the Elegance of Georgian England

Depart the Cotswolds travelling south to Bath, one of England most elegant historic cities. The morning begins with timed entry admission to the Roman Baths exploring the preserved complex and museum galleries. Continue with entry to Bath Abbey, an architectural landmark at the heart of the city. Lunch is reserved at The Ivy Bath Brasserie. In the afternoon enjoy admission to the Jane Austen Centre presenting the cultural world of Regency England followed by entry to No 1 Royal Crescent, a restored Georgian townhouse museum. Dinner is arranged at The Pump Room Restaurant. Overnight in Bath.



Day by Day Programme

DAY 7

Stonehenge and Historic Winchester

Travel from Bath toward Winchester through southern England's historic landscapes. The morning features admission to Stonehenge, the prehistoric monument whose origins remain one of Europe's great archaeological mysteries. Continue directly to Winchester where lunch is reserved at a centrally located restaurant. In the afternoon enjoy time to explore Winchester, including its cathedral and historic streets, offering a refined introduction to England's heritage with a balanced and well-paced routing. Dinner is arranged at The Ivy Winchester Brasserie. Overnight in Winchester.

DAY 8

Cambridge and Academic England

Depart Winchester travelling north toward Cambridge. The morning begins with admission to Kings College Chapel renowned for its Gothic architecture and choral heritage. Continue with entry to the Fitzwilliam Museum whose collections span art antiquities and manuscripts. Lunch is reserved at The Ivy Cambridge Brasserie. In the afternoon enjoy admission to the Cambridge University Botanic Garden offering a peaceful exploration of scientific discovery and horticultural heritage. Later transfer to London where dinner is arranged at The Savoy Grill. Overnight in London.

DAY 9

London's Cultural Treasures and Departure

The final morning focuses on London's cultural institutions. Begin with timed entry admission to the British Museum, home to one of the world's most significant collections of human history. Continue with entry to St Paul's Cathedral exploring the dome, crypt and galleries. Lunch is reserved at The Ned Restaurant within a historic former banking hall. In the afternoon enjoy time at Borough Market and along the Southbank, offering a vibrant and memorable conclusion to the programme. Your driver then transfers the group to London Heathrow Airport for onward departure.
