Day by Day Programme

DAY 1

Dublin: Capital Introductions and Cultural Foundations

Arrival into Dublin is followed by a composed introduction to the capital, beginning with timed-entry access to Trinity College's Book of Kells Exhibition, paired with a reserved visit to the Old Library Long Room. Lunch is pre-booked at a centrally located contemporary Irish restaurant. The afternoon continues with fast-track admission to the Guinness Storehouse, concluding with panoramic views from the Gravity Bar, before a scheduled visit to the EPIC The Irish Emigration Museum. Dinner is pre-arranged at a refined Georgian townhouse dining room. Overnight: Dublin.

DAY 2

Dublin to Kilkenny: Heritage Estates and Medieval Character

Departing Dublin, the route turns south with a pre-booked visit to the Irish National Stud & Gardens, combining equine heritage with landscaped Japanese Gardens. Lunch is reserved in Kilkenny at a well-regarded local restaurant. The afternoon features guided entry to Kilkenny Castle, followed by admission to the Smithwick's Experience, offering an engaging heritage interpretation suitable for all ages. Dinner is hosted in a historic dining room within the city walls, ensuring a relaxed evening within easy reach of accommodation. Overnight: Kilkenny.



Day by Day Programme

DAY 3

Kilkenny to Killarney: Castles, Crafts, and Scenic Progression

This morning includes a timed visit to the Rock of Cashel, one of Ireland's most iconic ecclesiastical sites, followed by admission to Blarney Castle & Gardens, with optional access to the Blarney Stone for those inclined. Lunch is reserved at the nearby Blarney Woollen Mills restaurant. Continuing west, a curated stop at the Muckross Traditional Farms offers an engaging glimpse into rural life. Arrival in Killarney is followed by a pre-arranged dinner within the hotel or a noted local restaurant. Overnight: Killarney.

DAY 4

Ring of Kerry: Landscapes, Estates, and Atlantic Perspectives

A full yet unhurried exploration of the Ring of Kerry begins with admission to Muckross House & Gardens, including a guided interior visit. The route continues with a pre-booked boat trip across the Lakes of Killarney, offering a gentle and scenic perspective. Lunch is reserved in a coastal setting along the Iveragh Peninsula. The afternoon includes entry to the Skellig Experience Visitor Centre, presenting the region's monastic heritage in an accessible format. Return to Killarney for a scheduled dinner in a characterful town-centre venue. Overnight: Killarney.



Day by Day Programme

DAY 5

Killarney to Dublin: Cliffs, Atlantic Coast, and Return

Departing early, the journey north includes priority admission to the Cliffs of Moher Visitor Experience, ensuring optimal access before peak hours. This is followed by entry to the Burren National Park Visitor Centre, providing context to the unique limestone landscape. Lunch is reserved in a well-regarded coastal restaurant near Lahinch. Continuing east, a final cultural stop includes admission to Clonmacnoise Monastic Site, offering a reflective close to the journey. Arrival into Dublin is followed by a pre-arranged farewell dinner in a premium city restaurant. Overnight: Dublin.
