## Day by Day Programme

### DAY 1

#### Arrival in Edinburgh Culinary Capital

Arrival at Edinburgh Airport where your private driver transfers the group to Scotland historic capital. The programme begins with timed entry admission to Edinburgh Castle to explore the Crown Jewels and historic fortress interiors overlooking the city skyline. Lunch is reserved at The Witchery by the Castle, a celebrated heritage restaurant known for refined Scottish cuisine. In the afternoon enjoy entry to the Scotch Whisky Experience including a guided tasting presentation and access to one of the largest Scotch whisky collections in the world. Continue with admission to the National Museum of Scotland.

Dinner is arranged at The Dome Restaurant. Overnight Edinburgh.

### DAY 2

#### Fife Coast St Andrews Heritage and Seafood

Depart Edinburgh after breakfast crossing the Queensferry Crossing toward the coastal landscapes of Fife. The morning includes admission to St Andrews Cathedral Visitor Centre where exhibitions explore the medieval religious capital of Scotland. Continue with entry to the British Golf Museum presenting the origins of Scotland national sport through interactive displays. Lunch is reserved at The Seafood Ristorante, renowned for locally sourced seafood overlooking St Andrews Bay. In the afternoon visit St Andrews Castle where dramatic cliffside ruins and siege tunnels illustrate Scotland turbulent past. Dinner is arranged at Timberyard Restaurant. Overnight Edinburgh.



## Day by Day Programme

### DAY 3

#### Highland Produce and Whisky Heritage

Depart Edinburgh travelling north through Perthshire into the Highland landscapes. The morning includes admission to Blair Castle and Gardens, a historic estate presenting centuries of Scottish aristocratic life. Lunch is reserved at The Atholl Arms Hotel in Pitlochry, known for traditional Highland cuisine. The afternoon continues with a guided visit to Edradour Distillery, one of the smallest traditional whisky distilleries in Scotland, followed by admission to Blair Athol Distillery Visitor Centre to explore the craft of single malt production. Dinner is arranged at Fonab Castle Restaurant overlooking Loch Faskally.

Overnight Pitlochry.

### DAY 4

#### Highland Landscapes Loch Ness

Travel north into the Highlands toward Loch Ness. The morning features admission to Culloden Battlefield Visitor Centre offering immersive exhibitions explaining the historic Jacobite uprising. Continue to Clava Cairns, a well preserved Bronze Age burial complex that provides insight into prehistoric communities. Lunch is reserved at The Boathouse Restaurant overlooking the Caledonian Canal. In the afternoon board a Loch Ness cruise from Fort Augustus followed by admission to Urquhart Castle positioned above the loch. Dinner is arranged at Rocpool Restaurant. Overnight Inverness.



## Day by Day Programme

### DAY 5

#### Highland Heritage Departure

The final morning begins with admission to Cawdor Castle and Gardens, a preserved Highland residence surrounded by formal gardens and woodland grounds. Continue with entry to the Highland Folk Museum where reconstructed buildings present traditional Highland life and rural craft across several centuries. Lunch is reserved at The Mustard Seed Restaurant set within a converted church overlooking the River Ness. In the afternoon enjoy admission to Inverness Botanic Gardens and Tropical House before your private transfer to Inverness Airport for departure.
